ACTIVITY: Fingerprint Discovery

You were created special by God. There are so many things about you that are unique, like your fingerprint. No one else has the same fingerprint as you.

YOU WILL NEED:

- Paper
- Marker or ink pad
- Wet paper towel
- Magnifying glass (optional)

STEPS:

1. Take the ink pad or marker and cover your pointer finger.
2. Quickly place your finger on the paper. You should be able to see your fingerprint. If you don't see it, try again with more color.
3. Take a close look, with or without a magnifying glass, at your fingerprint.
4. Ask a parent, sibling, or friend to get their fingerprint too!
5. Look at both fingerprints and see if you can see some differences.
